Fch: That's nice.

M: Yes, but he doesn't enjoy that. He never knows where to go.

PAUSE 00'05"

R Four

Fch: What about your mum? What's she doing today?

M: She's doing her newest hobby.

Fch: What's that?

M: She bought a new laptop for her work. And she found a website about drawing, so she's learning to do that.

Fch: Really? That sounds good.

M: She loves it and she's learning a lot.

PAUSE 00'05"

R Five

M: And my brother is in town today.

Fch: What's he doing there?

M: He's at the library. He's studying the old maps they have there.

Fch: Wow! I'd like to see those one day.

M: Me too, but I've got to go now, Lily. Bye!

R Now listen to Part 3 again.

PAUSE 00'03"
